GPA

The GPA computation is based on a weighted scale (A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0) with an additional 1.0 grade point given for each IB, AP, and Honors course with grade C or better. The GPA policy is made at the district level. Students are given academic GPAs, as well as total GPAs that include non-academic courses. CUSD does not individually rank its students, placing students into deciles instead.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

Athletics: Over 1,400 students participate in 27 different athletic sports. San Clemente Triton athletic teams are top contenders in the competitive Coast View Athletic Association of the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF). Almost every team was awarded Academic Distinction by the CIF-SS for having a cumulative (un-weighted) GPA of 3.0 or higher. Since 2000, SCHS has won 23 CIF Championships. The varsity football team was CIF and State Div. 1A Champions in 2016, and the surf team is the defending State Champion. In 2018-19, twenty-two graduating seniors signed a National Letter of Intent.

Co-curricular programs offered at San Clemente High School include award-winning instrumental music, cheer, dance, academic decathlon, and yearbook programs. Also available to students is participation in drama, vocal music, and Two-Way Immersion programs.

Organizations: SCHS offers 70 clubs on campus, including Associated Student Body, Model United Nations, AVID, National Honor Society, CSF, Be a Hero Become a Donor Club, Best Buddies Club, and Make a Wish Club.
